The Open University

If you want to improve your knowledge and skills but do not have the formal academic qualifications to apply to a traditional university, you can take an online degree at an open university.

One of the largest British universities is the Open University (OU), which had about 151,840 students in 2022. The Open University was established in 1967 and was the first university in the world dedicated to distance learning. Students do not have to go to classes on a daily basis. Instead, they study from home using books, videos, CDs and the Internet. In fact, the idea for the Open University came from the increasing popularity of television in the 1960s and 1970s, as people could learn from educational TV programmes. Additionally, students did self-study and some coursework. These days, they can usually communicate with their professors by phone or the Internet, or occasionally meet them face-to-face.

You can study at the Open University if you are older than 16 and there is no maximum age limit. Kathryn O'Donnell and David Cunningham have little in common, yet both have recently graduated from the Open University as the youngest and oldest graduates. Kathryn, who is from Cumbernauld, is 19 years old and David, who is from Leven in Fife, is 89. Kathryn chose the Open University because it allowed her to keep studying while managing her health condition. She is proud of her achievement and intends to continue her studies. Kathryn mentions that many of her friends are still at university, but she is now a graduate with a job. Meanwhile, David has already received his Bachelor of Law degree and is now working towards his next Open University qualification. Despite David's age, studying has become his way of life.

Moreover, the university helps around 10,000 disabled students by giving them the special tools they need, such as computer software for students who cannot see well. Disabled students receive extra attention to make sure they can perform well in their studies. They are officially a priority group at the university.

The Open University is also ideal for people who are working. Approximately 70% of students work full-time. Distance learning gives these students the flexibility to study where and when they like, at their own speed. Most Open University courses can be taken in Europe and some are available in many parts of the world. Indeed, more than 25,000 Open University students live outside the UK.

The goal of the Open University is to give everyone equal opportunities to learn new skills, get a better education and change careers. It offers a high-quality university education to anyone who wants to reach their educational goals.
